





Reducing bacteria

Oral hygiene recommendations

Brush twice daily with a power toothbrush

- Soft toothbrush head
- Sensitive or gentle power-brush setting
- Two minutes, quadrant tracking

Floss once daily

 String floss, pre-threaded flosser, GUM picks, water or air flosser (gentle setting)

Mouthwash or oral probiotic

- Mouthwash: Goal is to kill bad bacteria
- Oral probiotic: Goal is to promote good bacteria







Fluoride


- Should be in toothpaste or mouthwash
- Should be the final step in your routine, no food/drink for 30 minutes after

Home Care Tip: choose products that feel comfortable in your hands and gentle to your gums that have the ADA Seal of Acceptance



Improving oral pH

Dry mouth recommendations



Recommendations:

- Sip tap water or high pH bottled water throughout the day and night.
- Avoid sucking on cough drops, mints or candies.
- Try XyliMelts or saliva replacement products.
- Talk to your doctor about alternative medications if your dry mouth is medication-related.



Gum disease

Healthy gums = Healthy body

Facts about periodontal disease:

- Periodontal disease is caused by specific bacteria and is transmissible.
- Risk factors include:
 - Age
 - Genetics (family history)
 - Cardiovascular disease
 - Diabetes
 - Rheumatoid arthritis



- Periodontal disease is the No. 1
 cause of tooth loss in the US
- Half of Americans over age 30
 have periodontal disease. That's
 64.7 million Americans
- Over 70% of Americans over age 65 have periodontal disease





Diabetes correlation with gum disease

- 22% of Americans with diabetes have periodontal disease
- Diabetics with periodontal disease:
 - Have higher long-term blood sugar levels (A1c)
 - Are at a higher risk of progressing to insulin dependent diabetes
 - Have a harder time controlling their type 2 diabetes
 - Are at a higher risk of experiencing harm to eyes and kidneys, as well as heart attack or stroke

Alzheimer's correlation with gum disease

- Diagnosis of and death related to Alzheimer's is correlated to oral infection with *P. gingivalis* (the primary bacteria in periodontal disease).
- Beta-amyloid protein plaques found in the brain of patients with Alzheimer's may be produced in response to infection with *P. gingivalis*.
- This is an identified association between the two, not a causality.

- Tooth sensitivity, pain or tooth decay
- Reduced saliva production
- Bleeding gums
- Altered gums
- Burning tongue

Anticholinergics	Allergies, asthma, overactive bladder	Oxybutynin, Diphenhydramine, Cetirizine, Fexofenadine, Loratadine
Antidepressants, benzodiazepine, antipsychotics	Depression, anxiety, mood stabilizers	Duloxetine, Fluoxetine, Sertraline, Lorazepam, Diazepam, Haloperidol, Risperidone, Lithium
Antianginals, antiarrhythmics, beta blockers	Heart and blood pressure medications	Furosemide, Propranolol
Opioids	Pain	Norco, Percocet
Muscle relaxants	Spasticity	Tizanidine
Antiemetics	Nausea/vomiting	Promethazine

Staffing shortages

- A 2018 task force found the US needed 152K more dental health care workers¹
- 3.75% of all hygienists have left the profession since COVID-19²
- Staffing shortages have reduced dental practice capacity by 10%, according to the ADA³




Demographics

- A rapidly increasing older population needs more care
- Increased employment levels have given people more access to dental insurance
- Increasing referrals from medical doctors to dentists



Inflation

- Since 2020, inflation has resulted in a cumulative price increase of 18.64%
- Cost is cited as the top barrier to needed dental care in the US⁵
- People with insurance see the dentist more often than those without insurance (78% vs. 55%)⁶









Meeting the challenges

We continue to recruit network dentists

NETWORK CHANGES SINCE Jan. 1. 2024 - June 30, 2024

Delta Dental enrollees visited 2,714 Delta dentists nationwide

3 network dentists who treated ACERA retirees left the network due to Attrition

4 network dentists who treated ACERA retirees went Insurance Independent

1 network dentist who treated ACERA retirees was Involuntarily termed

2,952 newly added dentists are already treating Delta Dental members

115 Delta Dental ACERA retirees & dependents have been affected by the dentist turnover

- 80 were primary enrollees
- 35 were dependents
